1.	Extension of the 30mph speed limit on the A264 Langton Rd between the junction with Rusthall Rd and Langton Green.		High volume of traffic travelling at 40mph plus makes it a hazardous road to cross for walkers and churchgoers. Children from St Paul's Church of England Primary School in Rusthall cannot access St Paul's Church safely by foot as is the case with the disabled and those with mobility issues. With the Commons Conservators about to make significant investment in constructing an all-ability footpath along Happy Valley which attracts large numbers of people to Rusthall Common, a key element to its success is being able to access the path safely when crossing the A264. There is also the added hazard of deer and other wild animals crossing.	Extending the present 30mph speed limit from the junction of Rusthall Rd and Langton Rd to the Langton Green village sign and installing road signs giving warning of pedestrians crossing and also the possible threat of wild animals crossing the road.	
2	Lower Green Rd, Rusthall		Road used as rat run to by-pass TW town centre and significant number of motorists caught on Speedwatch sessions exceeding 20 mph speed limit by a considerable margin.	The installation of physical traffic calming measures from the junction between Lower Green Rd and Rusthall Rd and just beyond the Red Lion.	
3	Meadow Rd Ashley Gardens		Again, a popular rat run where flagrant disregard for 20mph speed limit is evident by significant numbers as highlighted by Speedwatch. Children's	EITHER changing priority at the junction between Meadow Rd and Erskine Park Rd and Ashley Gardens and Ashley Park/Ashley Park Close OR	

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			playground at the bottom of Ashley Gardens is a real danger spot. No 20mph signage or traffic calming measures.	installing speed bumps. 20mph roundels need to be painted onto Meadow Rd and Ashley Gardens.	
4	Southwood Rd and Cranwell Rd		Both roads have insufficient signage indicating a 20mph zone. A number of complaints have been received from local residents living in both roads of excessive speeding resulting in family pets being killed.	Introduce signage and traffic calming measures to support the 20mph zone.	
5	Junction with Common View and Rusthall High Street		Parking on the junction of Common View and Rusthall High Street causing potential hazard for both vehicles and pedestrians	Extending double yellow lines on Common View to parking bays on both sides of the road.	
6	Corner of Erskine Park Road and Rusthall High Street.		Vehicles obstructing bus stop and making bus difficult to access.	Change bus stop to make it more accessible for passengers. EITHER extend the double yellow lines to the bay for the bus stop which would result in losing a parking space OR move the bus bay up so it is adjacent to the double yellow lines thereby moving the existing parking space a few metres down from the existing bus bay	
7	Rusthall High Street		Lack of parking space for goods vehicles unloading in the High Street which causes issues with passenger accessibility at the bus stop outside One Stop.	Creating a loading bay available between 7am – 10pm which will require a traffic order. Additionally build out the kerb in order to assist bus passengers.
